



#### Materials:

Hook: Tiemco 200R or equivalent or other 2XL or 3XL nymph hook.

Any 8/0, 6/0, 70 dernier,140 dernier or equivalent thread Thread:

Tail and Body: Marabou, color(s) of your choice

#### Tying Steps:

Step 1: Lay down a thread base. Strip marabou a bunch from the stem. Use enough strands of marabou to make the fly as sparse or thick as you like. Tie in with the tips extending past the hook bend as the tail. Do not trim the rest.



Step 3. Wrap the marabou rope forward to just behind the eye and tie off. On longer/ larger flies the initial bunch of marabou may not be long enough to reach the hook eye. To fill out the hook shank tie in another bunch of marabou, twist into a rope as in Step 2, wind to the eye and tie off and trim. Finish the head and that's
