William Somer holds a BA in Aquatic Biology from University of California, Santa Barbara, and a MS in Fisheries Science from Humboldt State University. He worked for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife as a graduate student at the Cooperative Fisheries Research Unit, then for the Arcata Klamath River Project and the Trinity River Flow Study. He started with California Department of Fish and Wildlife in 1988 as a district biologist in the Sacramento Valley. He currently works on native trout restoration and wild trout management as a Senior Environmental Scientist on the Heritage and Wild Trout Project. Mr. Somer is a Certified Fisheries Professional recognized by the American Fisheries Society.



Map Of Chollas Lake Park



SDFF Conservation **Update from Gary** Strawn- Chair



The first weekend of October saw a small crew that hiked to Casa Vieja Meadow to take down the cattle exclusion fence that protects the meadow and allows the population of Golden Trout to flourish. For clarification, the fence is taken down due to the fierce winters at this altitude which would blow down the fence post and make the job of maintaining the fence difficult.

Due to the drought, they chose not to fish for the Goldens. Gary also reported that the South Fork of Kern River was bone dry at Kennedy Meadows along with Fish Creek. Luckily the water flow at the meadows looked good by comparison.

Locally, San Luis Rey River will be tested by our volunteer teams as part of the Southern Califoirnia Steelhead Trout Project. We should all hope for a very wet winter this year for the sake of all local water sources.


Puerto Penasco, Sonora, Mexico **Aka Rocky Point**


